Program Timeline

The Tech Project Coordinator program has three sessions per year, beginning in **Spring**, **Summer**, and **Fall**.

Courses are held fully online, combining self-paced modules with live instruction in the evenings.

To succeed in the program, participants must complete all assignments and assessments, including CompTIA ITF+ and Project+ credentials that require an in-person exam at a testing center. Once completed, participants will be matched to employers for a minimum one year of paid on-the-job training.

Admission Requirements

Participants must be:

- 17 years of age or older
- A high school or GED graduate
- Eligible to work in the U.S.
- Interested in technology and project management
- Able to commit to part-time or full-time work with an employer following the 8-week course
